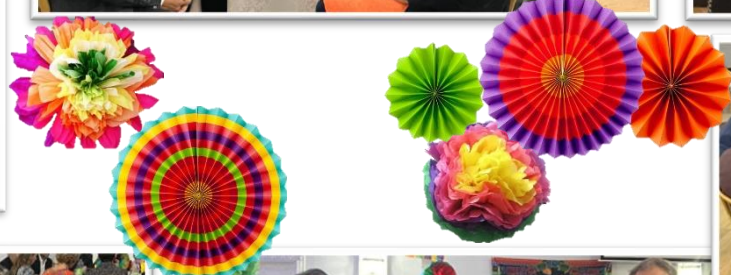

Making Time for Good Times!



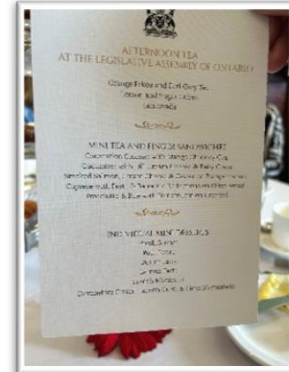

For a summer vacation, many in Friuli choose to go to il mare o le montagne. Depending on where they live in the region, either choice is a two or three-hour drive away.

In winter, it's the mountains, the Carnic Alps – Alps Cjargnelis – that provide excellent snow sport choices, entertainment, sheer beauty, and of course, sweet mountain air.

The Carnic Alps extend for some 100 km between the Tagliamento in the west and the Gail River in the east, forming the border between Austria and Italy. Although not as high as the tallest of the Alps – Mont Blanc rises 15,780 ft. – Coglians in the Carnic Alps is a respectable 9,127 ft.

Scattered over this area are some 25 resorts of varying size, offering advanced, intermediate and beginner skiing, snowboarding, cross-country and mountaineering, leisurely walking trails, and stunning scenery. Lessons are available at some resorts for adults and children. For a day or a few days, snow adventurers can choose from among large or small resorts and inns or hotels.

A sampling of the ski areas: Piancavallo, located 32 km north-east of Pordenone, offers 14 km of ski runs for skiers of all experience. To get up to the starting line are six ski tows and five moving carpet lifts. For those preferring to stay on the ground, there are 15 km of cross-country runs, a snow fun area and ice arena.



Tarvisio, 100 km north-east of Udine, offers 24 km of Alpine ski runs with 10 ski tows and three moving carpet lifts, plus 55 km of cross-country ski runs. There's also a ski school and snow fun area.

Sauris is located 100 km north of Pordenone. Its ski area offers Alpine and cross-country skiing, and a Zipline adventure.

Forni di Sopra, just over 100 km northwest of Pordenone, offers 13 km of Alpine ski runs and 14 km for cross-country skiers. After skiing, there's more fun at the Fantasy Snow Park and Forni di Sopra Ice arena.

There's even more adventure in the areas of Sella Nevea, Ravascletto-Zoncolan, and further south, the day and night skiing of Tolmezzo.

I Dolomiti: The Dolomites Mountain range, nestled in Friuli's northwest corner, offers some 30 snow parks over its 18 mountain peaks, including five that are part of the imposing Marmolada. (On a clear day, the Marmolada can be seen from Venice.) Skiers may also want to check out the Dolomiti Superski carousel, offering more than 1,200 km of slopes with 450 lift facilities, making it the world's largest network of lifts and ski slopes. It combines 12 ski resorts, including the well-known winter sports destinations of Cortina d'Ampezzo, Alta Badia, and Plan de Corones. www.dolomitisuperski.com

The Dolomites are recognized as a Unesco World Heritage Site. According to its website: "The Dolomites are widely regarded as being among the most attractive mountain landscapes in the world. Their intrinsic beauty derives from a variety of spectacular vertical forms such as pinnacles, spires and towers, with contrasting horizontal surfaces including ledges, crags and plateaux, all of which rise abruptly above extensive talus deposits and more gentle foothills."



Some members of the Famèe's Dolomite Ski Club have skied in Friuli over the years, visiting Malga Ciapella, Val Gardena, Cervinia and other sites. Formed in 1973 the club today has some 60 members. Each year it organizes a ski vacation to Quebec's Mont Tremblant. The next scheduled trip is Feb. 7 – 11, 2024.

While the views in the mountains are breathtaking all over the world, Mara Mian, president of the Dolomite Ski Club says that you know you're in Friuli when you're met with a shot of grappa at 8 AM and can look forward to a bowl of yummy pasta at lunch. A Passion for Mosaics – The Art and Craft of Mario Della Rossa

Mario Della Rossa, a longtime member of the Famèe Furlane of Toronto, is one of Canada's pre-eminent mosaicists. Born in 1942 in San Martino al Tagliamento, he was accepted into the world-famous Scuola Mosaicisti del Friuli in Spilimbergo at the tender age of 13. He graduated in 1959 and became fully dedicated to mastering this craft. He was also a semi-professional soccer player in the B Division and played goalie for the team in Arezzo. However, he decided to pursue his mosaic craft and emigrated to Toronto at the age of 22 to join his sister and family in 1964.

After working at Conn-Arts Studio for seven years producing wonderful mosaics in churches and buildings mostly in the Toronto area, the studio closed its door and no longer produced mosaics. Mario then seized the opportunity to form a partnership with Luigi Nasato, a well-known and respected mosaicist and designer from Istrana, Treviso. Together they worked with precision and patience creating beautiful works for many churches in the Toronto area like Ascension of Our Lord, Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Our Lady of the Airways in Malton, St. Andrew's in Etobicoke. A true "capolavoro" created in the 1970's are the mosaics in St. John Bosco Church in Toronto commissioned by pastor Fr. Nazzareno Coccia which include an altar frontispiece of the 12 Apostles, the 4 Evangelists and more throughout the church. It is one of the projects of which Mario is most proud. They worked together for 30 years.

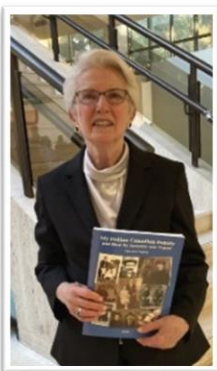

He is very grateful that he and his wife Grace were able live, work and raise three children by working every day doing something he loved.

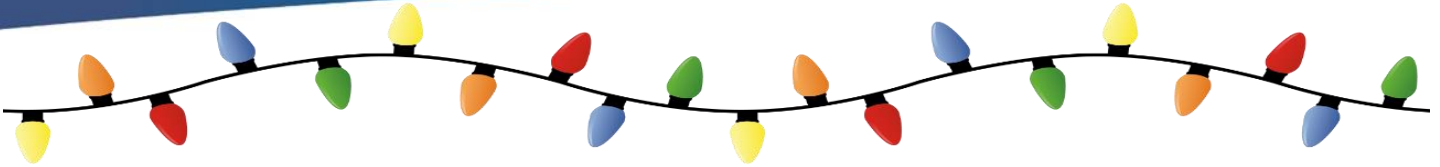

New Book Release My Italian Canadian Family and How Its Ancestry was Traced



Professor Emerita Olga (Zorzi) Pugliese, member of the Famèe Furlane Toronto, daughter of founding members of the association, and co-author of the history of its founding, has now published a genealogical study, titled *My Italian Canadian Family and How Its Ancestry was Traced*. Available from soleil@soleilpublishing.com, the book consists of 259 pages, including 154 pages of text, 18 family charts, and 265 photographs. It profiles her immediate family members and highlights some modern figures—both men and women—in the field of politics, business, and dressmaking over four continents. In her research Olga has applied palaeographical methods in the examination of records found in the archives of parishes in Friuli and has also utilized family correspondence housed mainly in the archive of the International Institute for Social History in Amsterdam. As she traces the history and origin of her grandparents' families in Friuli (the Zorzi, Pramparo, Cressatti, and Spagnolo) back to the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries, the findings coincide with her typically complex Italian DNA, which consists of five different ethnic components.

ATOR LA TAULA GNOCCHI FATTI A MANO



While this submission is not a “traditional family recipe”, it is a town specialty that has people from all over Friuli enjoying year after year. As many know, sagras in Friuli revolve around a local ingredient or dish, and the Sagra in Fauglis is no exception. The town has earned a reputation for its exquisite “gnocchi fatti a mano.” I can vividly recall as a teenager the countless hours spent peeling potatoes side by side with my aunt, and other volunteers, in anticipation of the three-day July event that draws countless people.

Driving through the town recently and passing the “Campo Sportivo” home to the annual sagra, I couldn't help but be flooded with memories of laughter, shared moments, and the unforgettable sensation of biting into the famous pillow-like, melt-in-your-mouth gnocchi. To my pleasant surprise, my aunt welcomed us with “un plat di gnocs” from that famous recipe, allowing for much reminiscing while enjoying! This year alone, the dedicated group prepared approximately 350 kilos of potatoes, 120 kilos of flour, and 400 eggs for their famous gnocchi! It speaks volumes of the love and enthusiasm poured into this cherished tradition, and its enduring popularity.

While perhaps not “ator la sagra taule”, I am happy to share this much-loved recipe for you to enjoy with your family.

INGREDIENTS:

500 g boiled potatoes
125 g. 00 flour (flour for pasta)
1 egg
2 tablespoons grated cheese
a pinch of salt
25 g of butter

METHOD:

1. In a large pot boil peeled potatoes until tender, remove from the pot and let cool.
2. Pass potatoes through a Potato Ricer.
3. On a flat surface mix together the flour and salt. Make a well in the middle and add the potatoes, egg, grated cheese, salt and softened butter. Mix together with your fingers to form a soft dough, it should not stick to your fingers.
4. On a lightly floured surface, cut small amounts of dough to form ropes and cut into 3/4-inch (2 cm) pieces.
5. Sprinkle with a little bit of flour and toss, so they don't stick together.
6. Let the gnocchi rest for 20 minutes before cooking.
7. In a large pot of salted boiling water cook the gnocchi. Gnocchi are ready when they float to the top.
8. Top with your favourite sauce and enjoy!

LIFE AT THE TERRACE

Happy 100th Birthday!



A milestone was celebrated on Oct 21 by one of the tenants of Friuli Terrace. Angela Silveri celebrated her 100th birthday. The celebration was also a milestone for Friuli Terrace as this is the first Centenarian to have celebrated while still living at Friuli Terrace. That this milestone was celebrated by one of the original residents of Friuli Terrace, and a very active resident at that, makes it even more special. Angela made Friuli Terrace her home in 1989 with her husband Vittorio. Sadly, Vittorio passed away in 1997. They had been married for 50 years. Both Angela and Vittorio were from Ofena in the province of Aquila in Italy where they met and were married. The couple immigrated in 1951 to North Bay, Ontario. Angela's daughters describe memories of a happy and secure childhood.

On the day of her celebration, Angela wore a beautiful red lace dress made by the birthday girl herself. The Activities Room was transformed with white curtains and twinkle lights. Flowers adorned a room filled with Angela's family and friends, including residents, past and present, staff of APM and CHATS as well as the Board of Friuli Terrace. A DJ played music accompanied by a singer. On special request by Angela, the DJ played Vecchio Scarpone in memory of Angela's husband who was an Alpino. Past Property Manager and current resident Sylvia was the master of ceremonies. She shared stories of Angela's first days as a resident of Friuli Terrace 34 years ago, the many contributions that she made throughout the years and how she remains an active member of the community today. One of her nephews, speaking with admiration of his aunt, said "she is an inspiration to all". Another nephew said a few words before leading the group in Grace. One of her daughters and three of her granddaughters lovingly spoke about their mother and Nonna and passed on some of Angela's words of wisdom. Staff members of Chats and past members of APM also spoke some words of appreciation of having the pleasure of getting to know Angela over the years. The food was prepared by one of her daughter's son-in-law and was abundant and delicious. As Angela says, "You have to feed the people". Although there was a lovely, sweet table with homemade treats, the main dessert was not one but three birthday cakes in the shape of the numbers

to make up 100! Although it wasn't possible for all the residents of the Terrace to participate in the lunch, Angela was kind enough to invite them all for cake and coffee.

In the initial years of Friuli Terrace, a government grant had allowed the Terrace to purchase sewing machines. A seamstress by trade, Angela suggested that they make items like tablecloths and aprons to sell at the Bazaar to raise money. With this the Club D'Amicizia was born. To this day she is still sewing and crocheting. For the most recent Bazaar she made bags with Christmas motifs which could be used as gift bags. Her smiling face can be seen at all events at Friuli Terrace and at any of them with meals she leads the Grace. Angela is devout and runs the Rosary sessions twice a week for the residents. During COVID, the residents were not allowed to physically gather so Angela conducted the rosary on Zoom. She is known as Our Lady of the Rosary. At the memorial mass, it is Angela's job to say the first reading.

When asked what her secret was, she said: "No secret. No magia. I try my best." Whatever her secret is, it is working because her mind is as sharp as the day she moved in. We hope that Angela's positive presence remains with us at Friuli Terrace for many more years to come. She truly is an inspiration to all those who have had the pleasure to meet her.

On October 11, the Board of Friuli Terrace held a Fall BBQ for its much deserving residents. The staff of APM management took care of the logistics and organizing this very successful event. There was a great variety of handmade items such as knitted hats, crochet baby items, pillows, Christmas gift bags, aprons and tablecloths. Hot ticket items were at the baked goods table, with the most popular being the crostoli, lovingly made by a few of the residents. Memorial Mass

The Memorial Mass has returned to Friuli Terrace for the first time since the pandemic. Our centenarian resumed her place by giving the first reading. The mass was well attended.

Other Activities and Programs at Friuli Terrace

York Region Paramedic Services – Community Paramedic Unit. CP@Clinic is an evidence and cost-effective based assessment and awareness program in partnership with McMaster University. Community Paramedics held regular clinics on Fridays for the residents at Friuli Terrace. The clinic was focused on evidence based chronic disease prevention, management, and health promotion. They provided blood pressure assessments, blood sugar assessments and various other health assessments during the clinic hours.

The goals of the CP@Clinic program is to:

- Improve older adult’s health and quality of life and support needs to “safely age in place” and prolong residents transition into a Long-Term Care facility.
- Reduce social isolation.
- Better connect this population with primary care and community care resources
- Provide a safe and inclusive environment with a focus on cultural diversity.

The clinic ran for six months ending in November. Residents could drop in voluntarily for a one-on-one assessment by the Community Paramedics. The paramedics are hopeful that a new program will be introduced in January, however, this has not yet been confirmed.

Sing Along - The Sing Along program was started in September with Antonella and will run every two weeks. This is a very popular event and attended by many residents.

CHATS Activities have begun with the reintroduction of the exercise programs. The activity director is looking to add some other programs in the next several months such as crafts in a group setting.

York Region Programs – York Region began offering Art Therapy and Seniors Yoga Classes in November which will run to January. The first Art Therapy class included making tissue paper flowers. The participants were pleased with their handiwork and enjoyed the session.



Roof Construction - Roof work at the Terrace including over the Bocce Courts, will begin in December and is expected to be finished before the end of the year. Please be careful when in the vicinity of the Terrace while this work is going on.

Upcoming Events – The Club D’Amcizia will be holding their annual Christmas dinner in December. A Christmas Luncheon hosted by the Board of Directors is planned for December 15.
