

Do you know how Friuli got its name, or that over the millennia it was invaded over 47 times? That Aquileia was one of the largest cities in the Roman Empire before it was sacked by Attila the Hun? How's your Furlan? Could it use some improvement, or do you just want to surprise your nonni with a bit of conversation in Furlan? Questions like these and others were answered for 25 lucky participants, while at the same time learning or improving their furlan language skills, both written and oral, no matter the skill level. The ten short weeks of the Furlan History and Language Class were packed with information.

Friuli's rich and complex history was brought to life under the guidance of Rosemary Maraldo and enriched by the lively recounting of the experiences of students and their families. Furlan language was taught by Andrea Cosolo, and Fernando Clabassi, and was tailored to both those wishing to improve their good language skills, and those who were pretty much beginners. All in all, the classes were a great



opportunity to learn how Friuli was shaped over the centuries, what forces helped create the culture we inherited and continue to enjoy, and to keep alive the language of our parents and grandparents.

As an added bonus, the last class featured a presentation by Bruno Meneguzzi, on the wonderful, award winning wines of Friuli, and included a tasting of a lovely white from the region. Students were presented with a

certificate of participation and were treated to cake and coffee to celebrate the end of the course. While this session is now complete, another session is planned for the fall. Not only are participants enjoying the opportunity of opening doors to Friuli, but also creating new friendships and having fun.

TREASURES OF SAN DANIELE

Prosciutto and the Biblioteca Guarneriana

Imagine you are in San Daniele and have just enjoyed a *panin* with perfectly aged prosciutto on fresh bread, along with a glass of cool white wine. Aiding your digestion is a view of the snow-topped mountains in the distance. You may be there during the *Aria di Festa sagra*, (an annual three-day event centring around prosciutto, held in early summer). In 2023 the *sagra* was held from June 30 to July 3.



While there, you may have toured a prosciutto producer's plant, and seen the pork legs hanging in rows during the aging process. There are talks on the production process and a demonstration of how to cut a serving using a sharp knife. Some say this is the best way to get that perfect slice.



San Daniele, with its cool mountain air, provides the perfect temperature and humidity to produce the best prosciutto. Today, Prosciutto di San Daniele is made strictly following the traditional production methods prescribed by law.

In addition to the focus on prosciutto, the *sagra* includes tours of the city, cultural displays and music. Bob Dylan was the headliner in 2016 as part of his European tour.

Library Visit? Yes

The next part of your stay in San Daniele includes a visit to the library. Yes, a library. There's the Civic Library on via Roma. And across the street at no. 10 via Roma is the Antiquities Collection of the Guarneriana, home to manuscripts from the 15th and 16th centuries.


The Guarneriana Library is a special depository of volumes. The library began with a posthumous donation of 173 manuscripts by the vicar of Aquileia, Guarnerio d'Artegna. He was born in Portogruaro or Zoppola in ca.1410. Having lost his father early, he was adopted by the Panciera family and moved with them to Rome in 1428 where he was trained within the Roman curia. He stayed in Rome at the service of Biagio del Molin, patriarch of Grado and recent chancellor of the Apostolic Chancellery. Guarnerio became a canon of Aquileia and later of Udine. He spent the last decade of his life – 1456-1466 - as parish priest of San Daniele del Friuli. In 1431 he had inherited the library of Antonio Panciera, composed mainly of books relating to canon law. These, plus the original 173 manuscripts, became the basis of the library.

The library grew substantially in 1736 when Giusto Fontanini endowed the library with his large collection of manuscripts and over 2,000 books. This prompted the local council to build a new home for the collection, including decorative oak shelving. Today, the Antiquities collection of the Biblioteca Guarneriana comprises 600 codices, 80 incunabula, hundreds of books from the 16th century and thousands of ancient manuscripts.

A very special document in the library is one of the oldest and most beautiful surviving copies of Dante's "Inferno". Copied in the XIVth century, it is fully illustrated with high quality miniatures. Many other copies are part of the collection of the British Library in London.

Aligned to the Guerneriana is the Scriptorium Foroiuliense, Italian School of Amanuensis – Ancient calligraphic art. Copies of ancient manuscripts are produced here, using methods from the 14th Century.

As part of Dante 700, the 700th anniversary of Dante's death in 1421, the Sciptorium created a version of Dante's Inferno, using the methods of book production from Dante's time. The copy is printed on paper, hand-made from cotton. Calligraphers recreated every word by hand, using sharpened quills made from goose or swan feathers.

Inks for the script and illustrations were made from gum Arabic with iron or mercury sulphate added to create red, azurite for blue and gold dust to create the gold ink. The book has a parchment on wood cover and is bound with rope; the entire process done by hand.

To celebrate Dante 700 in Toronto in October 2021, Prof. Paolo Granata, Associate Professor in Book and Media Studies at St. Michael's College, organized a special event in collaboration with the Department of Italian Studies at the University of Toronto, St. Michael's College in the University of Toronto, Massey College, Toronto, l'Istituto Italiano di Cultura in Toronto, the City of San Daniele del Friuli and the Scriptorium Foroiuliense.

A live video link with the Guarneriana Library was featured. Those in attendance learned about the library and saw a demonstration of how artists from the Scriptorium create manuscripts using ancient methods.

ATOR LA TAULA - Dolci Di Amaretti

My mom, Luciana Mian, treasured her cookbook called "Annabella in Cucina" by Vera. As far as I can remember that book was always handy in the kitchen. Not sure of the actual age of the book, but it's old.... Based on how worn the pages are, mom used it quite a bit. Today, it's stored in a Ziploc to keep it together for the next generation. Sharing with you is one of the recipes from the book that she made for her family hundreds of times. It is very simple and easy to make, in under 1 hour, from start to finish. As her grandchildren grew, mom couldn't just bake one cake; it was 2 to 4 so that each family got their own. My sisters and I translated the recipe from the Italian and continue to make this Dolce on a regular basis. I hope you enjoy it as much as our family did and still does! Buon Appetito!









Ingredients

200 Gr	Softened unsalted butter
200 Gr	White or Cane Sugar
4	Large Eggs at room temperature
	and separated
50 Gr	grated semi-sweet chocolate
125 Gr	White Flour
100 Gr	Hard Amaretti cookies, ground

Cream of Tartar

Method

- 1. Using electric beater, mix the butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
- Add egg yolks and grated chocolate and beat until well blended (about 5 minutes)
- In a separate bowl beat egg whites until "soft peak" stage and add the cream of tartar to help stabilize. Set aside.
- Add flour and the ground amaretti cookies to the butter mixture and mix by hand until well blended,
- 5. Gently fold the beaten egg whites into the butter mixture.
- 6. Butter and flour either a 9"square or 9" round baking pan. Baking pan can be lined with parchment paper, if preferred.
- 7. Bake cake in the center of a preheated 350° oven for 30 minutes. Cake can be tested at the 20-minute mark for doneness by inserting a toothpick in the cake centre. If fully cooked, toothpick will come out clean.
- 8. Remove from Pan and cool completely before dusting with icing sugar.



Thank you for being a part of our vibrant community. We look forward to sharing more wonderful moments with you in the coming months.



Transitioning to the new Ontario Not-For Profit Corporations Act

As noted by FFT President Joe Zamparo in his message to members, change is a constant in life. To add to the exciting FFT changes Joe has outlined, another element of change, mandated by the Ontario Government, is currently underway.

FFT Bylaws and Articles of Incorporation

On October 19, 2021, the Government of Ontario launched the Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporations Act. This Act requires that all not-for-profit boards, such as the FFT, update their bylaws and Articles of Incorporation by October 18, 2024. As a result, the FFT board has retained an external lawyer and is working with her to update both the FFT bylaws and Articles.

The next Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the FFT will take place on September 24, 2024. At the AGM, the board and the external lawyer will present a copy of the updated bylaws and Articles of Incorporation to the membership. At the AGM, the membership will vote on the updated bylaws and Articles of Incorporation.

Prior to the AGM on September 24, 2024,

- A summary of the changes that are being put forward will be mailed out to all members along with the Notice of the AGM and.
- The board will organize a special meeting where it will present the updated bylaws and Articles of Incorporation to the membership and answer questions.

Background

The current FFT bylaws were passed on June 27, 2006. On March 6, 2010, the Articles of Incorporation were amended to reflect the name change from "Famee Furlane Club of Toronto" to "Famee Furlane Toronto."

"Bylaws" are the rules that are established by the FFT to regulate itself and are consistent with applicable provincial laws.

"Articles of Incorporation" are the *formal documents that have been filed with the* provincial government *that legally document the creation* of the FFT.
